Reception Parents- please read this message from Mrs Hind

The Department for Education have issued a document called the DfE Nutrition Guidance which applies to all children aged 5 and under. this can be found here: <u>Early Years Foundation Stage nutrition guidance</u>. Copies are attached to the newsletter. We are now advised to implement the following practices for children in Reception:

- -A paediatric first aider will sit with your child in their sight when they are eating
- -Any small round foods will be sliced lengthways into quarters to prevent choking
- -Foods such as popcorn, hard sweets or lollipops will not be given to children as these are a choking hazard
- -Cooking with the children will include healthy foods to promote a healthy diet
- -Your child will be offered a choice of fruits and milk at snack time

Please could we ask for your support with the following when bringing in food from home such as packed lunches or celebration treats:

- -All round foods such as strawberries, cherry tomatoes should be cut lengthways into quarters to prevent choking
- -Please cut sausages lengthways for the same reason
- -Food should be non-perishable at room temperature (or have an ice pack included to keep food fresh)
- -Please consider healthy choices (we are sure you already do this!)
- -Celebration treats are always welcomed but please could we ask that these do not include choking hazards such as marshmallows, popcorn or hard sweets such as lollipops.
