Welcome Back - It has been lovely to welcome the children back to school this week and hear all about their Christmas break.

A few reminders:

- School hours are 8.45am – 3.15pm and lessons start promptly so please ensure children are at school on time. Children may enter school when the gate is staffed from 8.35am.
- Breakfast club runs from 8.00am – 8.40am and after-school clubs will start again next week from 3.15pm - 4.15pm. All after school club slips should have been returned. Any late requests, please come and speak to the office on Monday morning to arrange.
- If you are collecting/dropping off your child during the school day either side of medical appointments, please ensure they are signed in/out at the office.
- Please do not park on the roadside outside of school if possible as this can cause an obstruction for other road users and pedestrians. Please also be mindful of not parking on verges, or blocking driveways if you park around the village green.

- Please ensure Arbor is up to date ready for this new term. It is really good to get in the habit of paying upfront for school meals.
- Please ensure children come to school in the full correct uniform, including winter coats, hats and gloves when it is forecast to be cold. Please also ensure they bring their school bags with their reading books and records and wear car safety belts when travelling to and from school.
- Please ensure we have the correct contacts and contact details should we need to get hold of you or another responsible adult.
