Class 1 have had great fun playing in the snow, while learning about freezing and melting. They have also begun their guided reading sessions, this week focusing on the structure of a book.

Class 2 have been learning how to use knives, graters and peelers in DT. In geography they have been undertaking field work looking at human and physical features.
