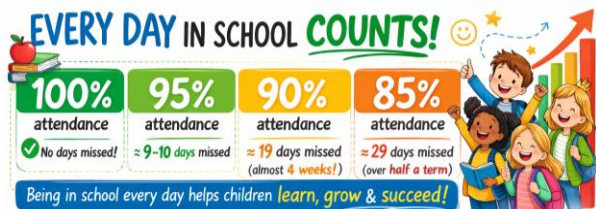


“Look to the LORD and his strength; seek his face always. Remember the wonders he has done, his miracles, and the judgments he pronounced.” –

Class 1 have had a farm focus this week. They have enjoyed exploring fruit and vegetables and how they grow to start their DT project

Class 2 baked cake on their fire in their forest school lesson. They also burnt miniature houses, recreating the Great Fire of London.

Class 3 have started to read ‘Cloud, tea, monkeys’ and the class became tea tasters for the day, sampling different varieties and flavours. They also learnt about ‘ripples’ in music and compared that to the water when they jumped in the swimming pool.

Class 4 have been getting to know our new student Mr Welford, beginning to explore our new class book about Anne Frank and looking at multiplying and dividing by hundreds in maths.

Across the school, at lunchtime we have been focusing on developing good table manners, including how to use a knife and fork correctly. This is an important life skill that helps children eat comfortably and confidently, especially as they move through school. We have noticed that some children are finding this challenging and are not yet able to use a knife and fork independently. To help support their development, it would be really beneficial if children could practise using a knife and fork at home during mealtimes where possible.
